Legislative process for WC issues

Legislature

- Senate 30 members
- House 60 members

Workers' compensation bills assigned to

- Senate Labor and Business Committee
- House Labor and Workplace Standards Committee
- Senate and House Judiciary Committees (Unfair Trade Practices Act)
- House Consumer Protection Committee

Appointments to boards and commissions (i.e. MLAC)

Senate Rules Committee, Senate confirmation vote

Legislative process for WC issues

Every bill needs to have the following:

- Public hearing(s)
 - Testimony from stakeholders, written or oral, in-person, or virtual
 - Recorded and posted online
- Work session(s)
 - Testimony limited to invited speakers
 - Committee vote, majority rules
 - Recorded and posted online
- Floor vote
- Repeat in other chamber

Management Labor Advisory Committee (MLAC)

Comprised of 10 members serving a three-year term

- 5 labor members
- 5 management members
- Appointed by Governor and confirmed by Senate

Monthly meetings, weekly during session

Purpose

- Advise the legislature on adequacy of benefits, medical and legal system costs, review legislative proposals
- Provide forum for stakeholder feedback
- Maintain a workplan







2025 Session

Timelines

Session started in mid-January

~3,400 bills introduced to-date

Remaining key dates for the remainder of the 2025 session

- April 9th First chamber deadline
- May 14th Revenue forecast
- May 23rd Second chamber deadline
- June 18th Target sine die
- June 29th Constitutional sine die

MLAC – meeting every week

Time loss bills

SB 705

For AWW below state AWW, rate is 100% of "net of payroll deductions"

SB 991

Removes two bases for a worker to refuse an offer of modified work

HB 2745

Time loss during investigation of a non-complying employer





Disability awards and training

HB 2802

Waiver of appeal rights for lump sum request

HB 2792

Payment of work disability award even if worker in training

Redetermination of PTD once training completed

Option for worker to postpone training

Presumption

SB 606

Extend PTSD and acute stress disorder presumption to OSH and SACU



Access to care

HB 3374

SAIF coordinating and managing care proposal

Improve access for workers

Control medical costs

Medical provider support

Expand AP to NP and PA

HB 3490

Allow chiropractor to be AP without restriction



Modernization

HB 2800

Changes "worker leasing company" to "professional employer organization" (PEO)

Reflect current business practice

HB 2799 attorney costs

Raise the \$1,500 cap and expand to all disputes

HB 3331 SAIF dividend

Divert part of SAIF's dividend to policyholders to set up an emergency preparedness fund

SB 5511 DCBS budget

WCD modernization & WCB "paperless system"

SB 946 BOLI funding

Transfer money from the WBF to fund BOLI, GRB \$ 15 million sweep

SB 558

PERS disability for firefighters and police officers with PTSD

HB 3329

Relating to SAIF's authority to set insurance rates

SB 885

Make SAIF an insurer of last resort for damages to homes due to wildfires
