





Now the North American office for the most innovative lumber scanning company in the world, the company was an early pioneer in the field of scanner solutions that utilize artificial intelligence.

They build products like the Lucidyne lineal lumber scanner. Capable of scanning up to 4,500 feet of boards per minute, the machine uses AI to identify defects and grade boards, giving mills more information about their lumber products.
